# Speaker: Tim Service

### **Presentation:** Preparing Your Bees for Winter

- Bees can live along time on just honey.
- 60lbs to 90lbs of honey stores needed (Less for Carniolan and Russian bees)
- Bees grow when they have protein.
- Pollen is their source of their protein.
- Pollen is the basis of brood food.
- It is responsible for the production of royal jelly.
- Winter Bees have fat bodies where they transform pollen into a substance called Vitellogenin, also known as the fountain of youth.
- Honey bees deposit **vitellogenin** molecules in Fat Bodies in their abdomen and heads. The Fat Body is a liver-like mass located near the wax glands. The fat bodies act as a food storage reservoir. Vitellogenin is made up of sugar, fats and protein
- Summer bees have little fat. They need to be light weight. They eat nectar and honey.
- Winter bees have abundant fat in order to be able to survive at least 6 months of a long cold winter.
- Overwintering mites consumes the bee's fat body! It shortens the lifespan of the bee by 2 to 3 weeks. It is important to check for mites.

### **Factors affecting Pollen:**

- Viruses At least 14 viruses can be found on pollen. Mites crawling around on blossoms hitch a ride on bees
- Fungicides If this is sprayed on blossoms when bees are there, they bring it back to the hive. (on pollen)

### **3 Common Methods for Checking for Mites:**

- Sticky Boards (Vaseline –wait 24 hours to count mites)

- Sugar Shake (spritzer bottle, confectioner sugar, paper plate, Mason jar with screen top lid, 100 bees about ½ cup, The spray bottle of water help to see the mites.) - Alcohol Wash (Kills the bees 🕃) (Put the bees in a jar with rubbing alcohol. Mites will be left in the bottom of the jar. )

#### **Choices of Treatment:**

\*Remember mites get resistant after a while and it is a good idea to have more than one type of treatment

- Apilife Var
- HopGuard (Only treats the phoretic mites- Those found on the bee.)
- Api Var
- CheckMite <a href="https://www.mannlakeltd.com/checkmite-trade-10-pack">https://www.mannlakeltd.com/checkmite-trade-10-pack</a>
- Formic Acid 85 degrees is the cut off temperature to use this. It targets mites under the brood cap!
- Oxalic Acid only works on phoretic mites (Shop towel method, Drizzle, Vaporizer-needs to be done every 7 days for 3 weeks)
- Mineral Oil fogger- Charlie Vanover has used this method. (Only treats phoretic mites)
- Mr. Clippard shared his mite treatment, which he learned about in the American Bee Journal, using Menthol and shop towels cut in half: Heat 2lbs. of Canola oil and 1 lbs. of menthol crystals in a 1 gallon, cleaned out can such as a tomato can. Add the shop towels that have been cut in half. Put in a metal paint can (never plastic because it will evaporate through the plastic) If you put it in the freezer, it will help prevent it from evaporating. Put one shop towel sheet on the top bar of the hive body of the brood chamber. You can also put two ApiStan strips on a paint stirrer and leave 45 days. http://www.brushymountainbeefarm.com/100-pack-Apistan-Strips

- Instant Gratification- smash them yourself.

<sup>\*</sup>Treat mites in August or as late as you can in the fall.

#### **Another Pest: Mice:**

• Put mouse guards at entrance- metal or hardware cloth (1/2" hardware cloth for mouse guards) FYI...Pollen traps have #5 hardware cloth

# Bee Biology – Wax Glands and Beeswax

- Wax glands are found on the honeybee's belly
- There are four pairs of glands located under segments 4-7 of the abdomen.
- They consist of three types of cells. (Epithelial, Oenocytes, and Adipocytes)
- Fat is the main ingredient in beeswax.
- They need lots of pollen and honey to make wax.
- Mann Lake and Better Bee have a large variety of candle wax molds.
- Beeswax can sell for \$16.00 per pound.
