Bee Biology - The Eye of The Honeybees

The honeybee has two types of eyes.

- 1. Ocelli or Simple Eyes They have three of these on top of the head that help with orienting.
- 2. Compound Eyes They help with identifying objects (ie. flowers, etc...). They have two of these eyes.
- Bees have polarized vision that helps them find the location of the sun even on cloudy days.
- They can see Ultra Violet light (UV). The ability to see UV light can help them find pollen.

Old Business:

• A report on how the National Pollinator Week Event went for the Hillsville Farmer's Market and the Wytheville Farmers Market was presented by the attending volunteers. 27 seed bomb packages gave a net gain of \$54.00. Literature was also given out. Seed packages with 10 seed bombs were sold for \$2.00.
